Madawaska Maliseet First Nation ("MMFN") is a signatory to Peace and Friendship Treaties which did not involve the surrendering of rights to lands and resources, a fact which has been recognized by the Supreme Court of Canada. As such, MMFN never gave up their legal rights to their lands, waters or resources. The members of MMFN have a deep spiritual connection to their territory and claim rights to hunt, trap, fish, and engage in other harvesting and traditional practices in their traditional territory. These rights are constitutionally guaranteed.

Energy East Pipeline Ltd. ("Energy East") proposes to construct and operate its pipeline and related components ("Project") through the territory of MMFN. MMFN is within approximately 10km of the Project. Thus, the Project, if approved, will go through the unceded territory of MMFN, over which they continue to exercise and claim constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights, including Aboriginal title. Additionally, such Project has the potential to cause significant socio-economic, health and environmental effects and also potentially impact the treaty and Aboriginal rights, including Aboriginal title, of MMFN.

Members of MMFN have been using the land in the Project area for generations. As such, they have traditional knowledge about the resources on the land, how such resources have been impacted in the past, and how these resources can and should be sustained for future generations. In particular, Elders and Land Users have expertise regarding the traditional use of the land and waterways in their territory and also have expertise on the location of sacred and other cultural sites in the vicinity of the Project. MMFN's submissions to the National Energy Board ("NEB"), including the evidence of the Elders and Land Users, will inform the NEB of the potential impacts the Project will have on: MMFN rights and interests, the ability of MMFN members to practice traditional lifestyles, and the environment in MMFN territory. MMFN also intends to file evidence from environmental technical experts to elaborate on MMFN specific concerns and potential mitigation measures. Finally, in addition to the evidence/submissions that MMFN will be making with respect to its rights and interests and associated environmental and socio-economic concerns, MMFN is collaborating with various other First Nation participants to jointly retain experts relating to areas such as the behavior of diluted bitumen in waterways to advise and file evidence on the potential impacts of a spill on MMFN's traditional territory.
