- adjacent landowners and occupants;
- land users (e.g., guides, outfitters and trappers);
- community members;
- municipal leaders and representatives (e.g., regional districts and municipalities);
- elected officials (i.e., provincial and federal);
- government agencies and representatives;
- non-government organizations; and
- emergency responders.

Reference ii) provides an update on stakeholder engagement;

In reference iii), NGTL provides an updated summary of landowner consultation and concerns, as well as updated stakeholder communication logs current up to 8 January 2016.

Request:

Please provide an update on consultation activities that have taken place with identified stakeholders, including individual landowners and landowner group(s), for the Project since 8 January 2016.

Response:

Below is an updated summary of NGTL's consultation with landowners (and landowner groups), environmental regulators, and other stakeholders (governmental and non-governmental).

Landowners and Landowner Groups:

Since January 8, 2016, NGTL has held approximately 100 landowner and occupant meetings and exchanged numerous related phone calls and emails. These discussions have covered the following topics:

- service of Section 87 notices
- landowner agreements
- soil, archaeological and wildlife surveys
- construction methods
- construction mitigation practices

In addition to these landowner and occupant meetings NGTL met with CAEPLA representatives in Dawson Creek on April 4-5 and April 25-26, and continues to work towards resolving CAEPLA's concerns through ongoing negotiations.

For an overall summary of NGTL's consultation with landowners and landowner groups please see Section 5.1.1 of NGTL's Reply Evidence.¹

Environmental Regulators

For a summary of all communications with environmental regulators since January 8, 2016, please see Attachment NEB 5.1-2. Since filing Additional Written Evidence, NGTL has engaged with four provincial environmental agencies:

- Alberta Environment and Parks (AEP)
- the BC Oil and Gas Commission (BC OGC)
- the BC Environmental Assessment Office (BC EAO)
- the Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations (MFLNRO)

As of filing this response, AEP has identified a specific concern regarding the Project. AEP has requested a reduction in temporary workspace (TWS) included on preliminary disposition sketch plans for the Project. As a result of these discussions, NGTL is evaluating the grade plan to determine if TWS requirements can be adjusted or reduced on Crown lands in Alberta.

Following the issuance of the British Columbia Supreme Court decision in *Coastal First Nations v. British Columbia (Environment)*, NGTL engaged the BC Environmental Assessment Office (EAO). On April 8, 2016, the EAO issued an order under Section 10(1)(c) of the British Columbia's Environmental Assessment Act stipulating that the Towerbirch Expansion Project (the Project) requires a provincial environmental assessment certificate, and asked NGTL whether the Project was ready to proceed through the provincial process. On May 2, 2016, NGTL responded that it was ready to proceed. In the response NGTL committed to provide information to the EAO to assist it in preparing the Referral to the Ministers for a decision to issue a provincial certificate for the Project. NGTL also stated that the Project is federally regulated and that NGTL understands that the Equivalency Agreement between British Columbia and Canada regarding environmental assessments continues to be valid. Concerns have been expressed by two federal environmental agencies, Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) and Health Canada, in letters of comment.³ NGTL responded to ECCC's concerns in its response to NEB 3.5 and Health Canada's concerns in its response to NEB 3.6.⁴

Stakeholders (Governmental and Non-Governmental)

Since January 8, 2016, NGTL has continued to provide opportunities for engagement with the stakeholders identified in the Application through participation at a Council meeting, four face-to-face meetings, telephone conversations, and participation at public events.

NGTL made a presentation to Dawson Creek City Council on January 18, 2016. The presentation included updates on: Project schedule, changes to the Project scope, peak workforce numbers, and plans for sourcing local accommodation and amenities. Follow up conversations occurred with Mayor Bumstead of Dawson Creek regarding these topics on January 19, 2016, February 19, 2016, and April 6, 2016.

NGTL participated in public events on behalf of the Project, including the Premier's BC Natural Resource Forum from January 19 to 21, 2016, in Prince George, Hudson's Hope Winter Carnival on January 24, 2016, in Hudson Hope, and the North Central Local Government Association 2016 AGM and Convention from May 4 to 6, 2016, in Dawson Creek. At these events, NGTL provided Project materials, maps and supporting information for discussion with stakeholders and provided further opportunities for public input into the Project. The events were focused on local government officials, economic development personnel, business and resource planning groups, and industry stakeholders in northeast British Columbia. Local government officials were notified through email that NGTL was interested in discussing the Project with them at the event and that a NGTL representative would be present at the event should they want to discuss the Project. Topics included Project schedule, route selection, status of regulatory review, market conditions and opportunities for local hiring.

NGTL contacted Northern Health via telephone on March 31, 2016, to provide information about the roles of NGTL and the NEB in the regulatory process, and to seek additional information regarding the concerns Northern Health identified in its Letter of Comment. 5 On April 20, 2016, NGTL emailed Northern Health Project facts sheets, contact information for the NEB Process Advisor and references to sections within the Application that specifically addressed areas of concerns identified by Northern Health, NGTL then participated in a conference call with Northern Health on April 29, 2016, and an in-person meeting on May 4, 2016. During the conference call NGTL provided additional information about Project scope and scale. Northern Health expressed concerns about use of health services, impact of workforce on the community, socio-economic effects management, post-construction emergency management plans and reiterated concerns it identified in its Letter of Comment submitted to the National Energy Board. During the in-person meeting. Northern Health provided additional explanations around their concerns about the Project's effects on health services, issues surrounding extending services to a non-resident workforce and concerns about the Project affecting Northern Health's overall resources. NGTL and Northern Health discussed potential mitigation measures and NGTL committed to considering opportunities for incorporating additional measures into project plans. Formal commitments were provided in response to NEB 3.6⁷ and the concerns of Northern Health in Section 7 of Reply Evidence.⁸

Response:

An update on NGTL's engagement with Aboriginal communities spanning the period between January 1 and May 24, 2016, can be found below. Please also see Attachment NEB 5.2-1 for updated Aboriginal Engagement Logs covering the same time span. NGTL will continue to engage all Aboriginal communities who have an interest in the Project.

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Blueberry River First Nations (BRFN)

On January 26, 2016, NGTL met with BRFN to discuss the Project, engagement expectations, and BRFN's interest in conducting a Project-specific TLU study.

On February 16, 2016, NGTL emailed BRFN a memo outlining the BRFN information intended to be included in the TK Supplemental Report. On February 26, 2016, NGTL received a letter from BRFN stating that BRFN does not agree with the inclusion of BRFN's information in the TK Supplemental Report.

On March 1, 2016, NGTL received confirmation that BRFN was interested in conducting an independent TLU study; BRFN also requested Project shapefiles to initiate the study which NGTL provided later the same day. On April 14, 2016, BRFN sent NGTL a proposal for capacity funding. NGTL agreed to the proposal on May 3, 2016. NGTL subsequently provided BRFN with Engagement Capacity Funding and TEK/TLU Study Protocol Agreements for BRFN's consideration on May 11, 2016. NGTL is currently waiting for BRFN's response to the proposed Engagement Capacity Funding and TEK/TLU Study Protocol Agreements.

NGTL has invited BRFN to participate in the supplemental archaeological studies occurring in spring 2016.

British Columbia Métis Federation (BCMF)

NGTL and BCMF continue to engage on the Project through the Project-specific Letter of Agreement (LOA) which includes capacity funding to BCMF affiliated communities (including DCMF, FSJMS, and RRMS).

On January 7, 2016, NGTL met with BCMF to provide a Project update and discuss the procurement process for contracting opportunities relating to the Project. On January 13, 2016, NGTL received a phone call from BCMF indicating that BCMF has opened up a new consultation office and requires a summary of engagement with BCMF and BCMF's affiliated communities to date. NGTL followed up with BCMF on January 15, 2016, to provide BCMF with additional Project information and engagement summaries outlining activities with BCMF and BCMF affiliated communities to date. NGTL met again with BCMF on February 4, 2016, to further discuss the Project, and plans for future engagement.

On February 16, 2016, NGTL emailed BCMF a memo outlining the BCMF information intended to be included in the TK Supplemental Report. NGTL received BCMF's comments regarding the TK Supplemental Report on February 20, 2016, and made the recommended revisions.

Previously, RRMS (a BCMF affiliated community) had advised NGTL that the Project was not in RRMS's area of interest and they were not interested in being engaged on the Project. However, as part of the BCMF's review of Project

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information, on February 18, 2016, NGTL received direction from BCMF to re-engage with RRMS. NGTL's engagement with RRMS is discussed separately below.

Dawson Creek Métis Federation (DCMF)

NGTL has continued to provide DCMF with Project Notifications at regulatory milestones; however, NGTL has not received any further communications from DCMF in response. NGTL remains available to engage and will respond to any requests or concerns DCMF may have regarding the Project.

Fort St. John Métis Society (FSJMS)

On February 2, 2016, NGTL called FSJMS to discuss the Project. FSJMS indicated to NGTL that FSJMS wanted to participate as an Intervenor at the hearing to ensure that NGTL appropriately minimizes potential adverse impacts to wildlife and environment. NGTL offered to meet with FSJMS to discuss the Project further and has not received a response from FSJMS.

Red River Métis Society (RRMS)

Previously, RRMS had advised NGTL that the Project was not in RRMS's area of interest and they were not interested in being engaged on the Project. However, as part of the BCMF's (with whom RRMS is affiliated) review of Project information, on February 18, 2016, NGTL received direction from BCMF to re-engage with RRMS.

On February 24, 2016, NGTL called RRMS to discuss the details and confirm their interest in participating in an Environmental Socio-economic Assessment (ESA) workshop. On April 19, 2016, NGTL and RRMS confirmed the logistical details and agreed to tentatively hold the Project ESA workshop on June 25, 2016.

Dene Tha' First Nation (DTFN)

NGTL has continued to provide DTFN with Project Notifications at regulatory milestones; however, NGTL has not received any further communications from DTFN in response. NGTL remains available to engage and will respond to any requests or concerns DTFN may have regarding the Project.

Doig River First Nation (DRFN)

On February 16, 2016, NGTL sent DRFN, via email, a memo outlining the DRFN information intended to be included in the TK Supplemental Report. NGTL provided additional information regarding the intent of the information contained in the TK Supplement Report and offered to meet with DRFN to discuss the TK Supplemental Report further on March 21, 2016.

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On March 25, 2016, NGTL received confirmation that DRFN had agreed to the proposed Engagement Capacity Funding Agreement and that DRFN's Final TLU Study Report was undergoing final revisions prior to being sent to NGTL. NGTL is waiting to receive a copy of DRFN's Final TLU Study Report and a Band Council Resolution to authorize the execution of the proposed Engagement Capacity Funding Agreement. Upon receipt, the findings of DRFN's TLU study will be reviewed by NGTL in the context of the ESA and considered for incorporation into Project planning, including the Environmental Protection Plan (EPP) and the Environmental Alignment Sheets (EAS), as appropriate.

NGTL has invited DRFN to participate in the supplemental archaeological studies occurring in spring 2016.

Duncan's First Nation (DFN)

On February 16, 2016, NGTL sent DFN, via email, a memo outlining the DFN information intended to be included in the TK Supplemental Report. NGTL provided additional information regarding the intended use of the information contained in the TK Supplement Report on March 3, 2016 and inquired if DFN was interested in an ESA workshop. NGTL did not receive a response from DFN with respect to the ESA workshop. On March 28, 2014, NGTL received a letter containing DFN's comments on the information contained in the TK Supplemental Report.

On March 15, 2016, NGTL met with DFN to discuss Project timelines, information to be included in the TK Supplemental Report and to confirm DFN's interest in conducting a TLU study. At this meeting, DFN indicated they would prefer to conduct a Map Review and Site Assessment instead of TLU study.

NGTL received a letter of non-objection for the Project from DFN on March 29, 2016. On April 5, 2016, NGTL sent DFN the proposed Map Review and Site Assessment Protocol Agreement for review. To date, NGTL has not received a response to the proposed Map Review and Site Assessment Protocol Agreement.

NGTL has invited DFN to participate in the supplemental archaeological studies occurring in spring 2016.

Fort Nelson First Nation (FNFN)

On January 6, 2016, NGTL verified FNFN's contact information and received confirmation that FNFN had received the Project update sent on December 17, 2015.

With the exception of NGTL's inquiry regarding FNFN's contact information and receipt of the December 2015 Project update, NGTL has had no further communication with FNFN with respect to the Project but remains available to engage and will respond to any requests or concerns FNFN may have regarding the Project.

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Halfway River First Nation (HRFN)

NGTL has continued to provide HRFN with Project Notifications; however, NGTL has not received any further communications from HRFN in response. NGTL remains available to engage and will respond to any requests or concerns HRFN may have regarding the Project.

Horse Lake First Nation (HLFN)

On January 18, 2016, NGTL provided HLFN with draft responses via email to HLFN's Map Review and Site Assessment Report. NGTL met with HLFN on January 20, 2016, to discuss the Project, the results of HLFN's Map Review and Site Assessment Report, and NGTL's draft responses to the report outcomes. At HLFN's request, NGTL revised the format of the responses and provided HLFN with a revised response document on March 30, 2016. As per the recommendations made in HLFN's Map Review and Site Assessment Report, NGTL and HLFN agreed to have HLFN's elders and members harvest a culturally important species identified along the Project right-of-way as a part of NGTL's commitment to mitigate potential impacts to HLFN. Additionally, NGTL is waiting for additional information from HLFN regarding the locations of potential mineral licks identified in HLFN's Map Review and Site Assessment Report so that the locations can be included in the Project's Environmental Alignment Sheets.

On February 16, 2016, NGTL emailed HLFN a memo outlining the HLFN information intended to be included in the TK Supplemental Report. NGTL did not receive a response outlining any concerns with NGTL's memo.

On March 30, 2016, NGTL provided HLFN with additional Project information including: the planned Horizontal Directional Drill (HDD) of the Kiskatinaw River, NGTL's TLU Site Discovery Contingency Plan and Alberta Environment and Parks recommendations for restricting public access to the Project right-of-way.

NGTL has invited HLFN to participate in the supplemental archaeological studies occurring in spring 2016.

Kelly Lake Cree Nation (KLCN)

On January 6, 2016, NGTL met with KLCN to provide a Project Update and an overview of the Project schedule and potential contracting opportunities. On January 25, 2016, NGTL provided KLCN with additional information with respect to the December 17, 2015, Project Update wherein NGTL had notified communities about an additional two proposed meter stations.

On February 16, 2016, NGTL sent KLCN, via email, a memo outlining the KLCN information intended to be included in the TK Supplemental Report. NGTL did not receive a response outlining any concerns with NGTL's memo.

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NGTL met with KLCN again on April 28, 2016, to provide a Project update, discuss timelines, and the status of KLCN's Final TLU Study Report. NGTL anticipates receipt of KLCN's Final TLU Study Report in May 2016. Upon receipt, the findings of KLCN's TLU study will be reviewed by NGTL in the context of the ESA, including the Environmental Protection Plan (EPP) and the Environmental Alignment Sheets (EAS).

NGTL has invited KLCN to participate in the supplemental archaeological studies occurring in spring 2016.

Kelly Lake First Nation (KLFN)

On February 17 and 18, 2016, NGTL received requests from KLFN inquiring about potential contracting and employment opportunities on the Project. NGTL responded that potential contracting and employment opportunities will be available in late 2016 and early 2017.

With the exception of KLFN's inquiry regarding potential contracting and employment opportunities, NGTL has had no further communication with KLFN with respect to the Project but remains available engage and will respond to any requests or concerns KLFN may have regarding the Project.

Kelly Lake Métis Settlement Society (KLMSS)

On March 11, 2016, KLMSS requested from NGTL copies of the Section 52 Hearing Notice and Application to Participate information originally provided to KLMSS on October 28, 2015. NGTL provided the information requested to KLMSS on March 11, 2016 and again on April 11, 2016.

On April 11, 2016, KLMSS phoned NGTL to discuss the details of the existing Project agreement.

McLeod Lake Indian Band (MLIB)

On February 16, 2016, NGTL emailed MLIB a memo outlining the MLIB information intended to be included in the TK Supplemental Report. On February 25, 2016, NGTL received an email from MLIB expressing concerns that the information included in the memo will be used in lieu of MLIB TLU study in the TK Supplemental Report. On February 25, 2016, NGTL provided clarification regarding the intent of the information contained in the TK Supplement Report. Further, NGTL explained that the information included in the memo does not replace MLIB's TLU study and requested confirmation that MLIB is still interested in conducting a TLU study for the Project. NGTL did not receive a response outlining any further concerns with NGTL's memo.

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On May 3, 2016, NGTL requested MLIB confirm their interest in conducting a Project-specific TLU study. MLIB responded and re-affirmed their interest in conducting a TLU Study on May 11, 2016. NGTL is currently awaiting MLIB's TLU Study proposal.

NGTL has invited MLIB to participate in the supplemental archaeological studies occurring in spring 2016.

Métis Nation of Alberta (MNA)

NGTL continues to provide MNA with Project Notifications at regulatory milestones; however, NGTL has not received any further communications from MNA in response. NGTL remains available to engage and will respond to any requests or concerns MNA may have regarding the Project.

Métis Nation of Alberta, Region 4 (MNA Region 4)

NGTL continues to provide MNA Region 4 with Project Notifications at regulatory milestones; however, NGTL has not received any further communications from MNA Region 4 in response. NGTL remains available to engage and will respond to any requests or concerns MNA Region 4 may have regarding the Project.

Métis Nation of Alberta, Region 6 (MNA Region 6)

MNA Region 6 confirmed their interest in conducting a Traditional Use (TU) study for the Project on January 15, 2016. Since then NGTL has been negotiating a TU Study Protocol Agreement with MNA Region 6. NGTL submitted a TU study proposal for MNA Region 6's consideration on May 11, 2016, and is currently awaiting a response from MNA Region 6.

Grande Prairie Métis Local 1990 (GPML 1990)

NGTL continues to provide GPML 1990 with Project Notifications at regulatory milestones; however, NGTL has not received any further communications from GPML 1990 in response. NGTL remains available to engage and will respond to any requests or concerns GPML 1990 may have regarding the Project.

Métis Nation of British Columbia (MNBC)

On February 16, 2016, NGTL sent MNBC, via email, a memo outlining the MNBC information intended to be included in the TK Supplemental Report. On February 19, 2016, MNBC requested additional Project Shapefiles to help MNBC confirm the specific locations of potentially affected sites identified in MNBC's TU Study Report for the Project. NGTL provided MNBC with additional Project Shapefiles on February 23, 2016. On March 17, 2016, MNBC provided NGTL with additional information regarding the potentially affected sites to be included in the

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TK Supplemental Report; NGTL incorporated that information into the TK Supplemental Report.

On March 2, 2016, NGTL received notice from MNBC that there were three new MNBC chartered Métis communities and informed NGTL that additional information would be provided shortly. On April 26, 2016, NGTL followed up with MNBC requesting additional information regarding the three new MNBC chartered Métis communities and direction on how NGTL is to engage with these communities on the Project. NGTL is currently awaiting a response from MNBC with the additional information regarding the three new MNBC chartered Métis communities.

Moccasin Flats Métis Society (MFMS)

NGTL continues to provide MFMS with Project Notifications at regulatory milestones; however, NGTL has not received any further communications from MFMS in response. NGTL remains available to engage and will respond to any requests or concerns MFMS may have regarding the Project.

North East Métis Association (NEMA)

On February 16, 2016, NGTL sent NEMA, via email, a memo outlining the NEMA information intended to be included in the TK Supplemental Report. NGTL did not receive a response outlining any concerns with NGTL's memo. With the exception of this memo, NGTL has had no further communication with NEMA with respect to the Project but remains available to engage and will respond to any requests or concerns NEMA may have regarding the Project.

Prophet River First Nation (PRFN)

On January 25, 2016, PRFN called to inform NGTL that PRFN was still reviewing the proposed Engagement Capacity Funding Agreement and that PRFN would not be conducting a TLUS for the Project until the ongoing Community Agreement negotiations with TransCanada (TCPL) have been concluded.

On February 16, 2016, NGTL emailed PRFN a memo outlining the PRFN information intended to be included in the TK Supplemental Report. PRFN acknowledged receipt of NGTL's memo via email later the same day and did not outline any concerns with NGTL's memo.

On May 3, 2016, NGTL emailed PRFN to inquire if PRFN was still not entering into a Project-specific TLUS agreement with NGTL until the overarching Community Agreement negotiations with TCPL were concluded. NGTL explained that the ability to include TLU information in Project design and planning becomes limited as the Project moves closer to construction. PRFN indicated that the email would be forwarded to PRFN Chief and Council for review and comment on how PRFN would like to move forward with the TLUS. On May 16, 2016, PRFN informed NGTL that

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PRFN will be moving forward with the TLUS and will provide NGTL with a TLU proposal by the end of May 2016.

NGTL has invited PRFN to participate in the supplemental archaeological studies occurring in spring 2016.

Saulteau First Nations (SFN)

On February 9, 2016, NGTL and SFN signed a LOA to provide SFN with capacity funding to conduct site visits on the Project. On February 17, 2016, NGTL sent SFN, via email, a memo outlining the SFN information intended to be included in the TK Supplemental Report. NGTL did not receive a response outlining any concerns with NGTL's memo.

NGTL has invited SFN to participate in the supplemental archaeological studies occurring in spring 2016.

Treaty 8 Tribal Council (T8TC)

NGTL continues to provide T8TC with Project Notifications at regulatory milestones; however, NGTL has not received any further communications from T8TC in response. NGTL remains available to engage and will respond to any requests or concerns T8TC may have regarding the Project.

West Moberly First Nations (WMFN)

On February 23, 2016, NGTL and WMFN met to discuss ongoing engagement on the Project and WMFN confirmed their interest in conducting a Project-specific TLUS. Following the meeting, NGTL provided WMFN with a draft Engagement Capacity Workplan and WMFN provided NGTL with a TLU Study proposal and protocol agreement as well as a proposal for an independent technical review.

On February 23, 2016, NGTL emailed WMFN a memo outlining the WMFN information intended to be included in the TK Supplemental Report. NGTL did not receive a response outlining any concerns with NGTL's memo.

As per WMFN's request, NGTL provided WMFN with Project shapefiles on March 8, 2016. On March 16, 2016, WMFN requested additional data to assist the TLUS teams. NGTL provided the additional data to WMFN later the same day.

On April 26, 2016, NGTL followed up with WMFN with regards to the proposed Engagement Capacity Funding, Independent Technical Review, and TLU Study Protocol Agreements. On April 27, 2016, WMFN informed NGTL that they have not had the opportunity to review the proposed agreements and will review them as soon as WMFN is able. On May 15, 2016, WMFN provided NGTL with edits to the

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proposed agreements. NGTL is currently reviewing WMFN's edits and will respond to WMFN as soon as possible.

NGTL has invited WMFN to participate in the supplemental archaeological studies occurring in spring 2016.

Western Cree Tribal Council (WCTC)

NGTL continues to provide WCTC with Project Notifications at regulatory milestones; however, NGTL has not received any further communications from WCTC in response. NGTL remains available to engage and will respond to any requests or concerns WCTC may have regarding the Project.

Description of the Project

Preamble:

In reference i), NGTL states that in order to achieve its proposed construction schedule and desired in-service dates, it requires temporary access to select areas along the proposed route to prepare temporary right-of-way access and establish temporary stockpile sites and contractor yards prior to the commencement of pipeline construction. Reference i) states that work on this temporary infrastructure is scheduled to begin in late Q1 2017, subject to receipt of regulatory approval and landowner consent.

In reference i), NGTL seeks an exemption under section 58 of the NEB Act from the detailed route process for routing associated with temporary infrastructure. Reference i) states that an exemption is also sought to enable NGTL to begin right-of-way (ROW) preparation activities (including clearing, stripping and grading) in certain locations.

Reference i) specifies that in aggregate, this preparatory work will not exceed 40 km in ROW length.

Reference ii) sets out the filing requirements for applications for physical projects including the following:

- identify and describe the project components, activities and related undertakings;
- describe the project location and the criteria used to determine the proposed route or site; and
- describe how and when the project will be carried out.

Request:

Please provide additional details about NGTL's intended ROW preparation activities for which it seeks an exemption under section 58 of the NEB Act which meet the filing requirements set out in reference ii). These details should include, but are not limited to, the following:

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- a) a description or explanation of the "certain locations" where NGTL intends to begin ROW preparation activities ahead of pipeline construction; and
- b) an explanation of how the ROW preparation activities associated with the section 58 activities would be differentiated from those associated with the section 52 facilities of the Project.

Response:

- a) The "certain locations" where NGTL proposes to commence right-of-way preparation activities ahead of pipeline construction include:
 - horizontal direction drilling (HDD) crossing locations
 - locations along the right-of-way requiring clearing in order to minimize the risk of incidental take of migratory birds, their nests and eggs
 - areas where construction could be restricted or delayed due to summer fire ban ratings

Additionally, as outlined in the Section 8.2 of the Application¹ and Section 6.2.2 of Additional Written Evidence,² activities not related to right-of-way preparation, but also requested under section 58 of the NEB Act include:

- meter station site preparation and construction
- temporary facilities (stockpile sites, contractor yards and temporary access for HDD bore sites)

NGTL proposes to conduct these activities under section 58 of the NEB Act beginning in late Q1 2017, only after the CPCN has been issued for the Project and applicable conditions are satisfied.

b) ROW preparation activities associated with the section 58 activities would be differentiated from those associated with the section 52 facilities of the Project in that while the section 58 activities involve activities such as clearing, stripping, and grading, they do not involve trenching or pipe installation. Right-of-way preparation activities, under Section 58, will be limited to the locations and activities described in the Section 58 EPP.

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As outlined in the Section 8.2 of the Application⁴ and Section 6.2.2 of Additional Written Evidence,⁵ Section 58 activities:

- expedite activities that require additional preparation (e.g., HDD crossing locations)
- facilitate preparation of areas that are required early (e.g., meter station sites and stockpile sites)
- minimize the risk of incidental take of migratory birds, their nests or eggs by conducting the requested Section 58 activities outside of the Restricted Activity Period (RAP)

Reference i) states that the Project would cross several riparian zones with a BC Oil and Gas Commission (BC OGC) Area-Based Analysis (ABA) status of "Enhanced Management" and "Regulatory Policy Under Review." Reference i) indicates that the Environmental Protection Plan for the Project (EPP) includes mitigation measures for maintaining the ecosystem function of riparian areas that align with the desired ABA outcomes for pipelines and ancillary activities and temporary work spaces.

Reference i) states that a mitigation strategy and watercourse crossing information and mitigation measures for the identified crossings classified as 'Enhanced Management' and 'Regulatory Review' will be submitted to the BC OGC prior to construction with the NEB Provincial Pipeline Authorization Application for the Project.

Reference ii) outlines filing requirements regarding mitigation measures for cumulative effects which include describing the general and specific mitigation measures, beyond project-specific mitigation already considered, that are technically and economically feasible to address any cumulative effects.

Request: Please provide:

- a) clarification on whether NGTL expects additional mitigation measures beyond what is already included in the EPP to be required for those riparian zones with a status of "Enhanced Management" and "Regulatory Policy Under Review;
- b) a description of what additional mitigation could be applied in these areas;
- c) the locations of those impacted riparian zones which have a status of "Enhanced Management" and "Regulatory Policy Under Review; and

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d) the amount of area in each zone which would be impacted by the Project.

Response:

a) and b)

NGTL does not expect that additional mitigation measures will be required by the BC OGC through its review of the NEB Provincial Pipeline Authorization Application for the Project (NEBPPAA). The NEBPPAA is the application by which projects regulated under the National Energy Board Act can apply to use and access Crown land in BC, as well as to seek additional provincial permits required to carry out their activities.

- c) The locations of the riparian zones with a status of "Enhanced Management" and "Regulatory Policy Under Review" are included on the updated Environmental Alignment Sheets that were filed with the Board on March 30, 2016. These are summarized in Table 6 of the updated Environmental Alignment Sheets.
- d) Approximately 1.8 ha of land in the Lower Kiskatinaw River Water Basin Management area with an ABA status of "Enhanced Management" will be impacted by the Project. Approximately 0.9 ha of land in the Pouce Coupé River Water Basin Management area with an ABA status of "Regulatory Policy Under Review" will be impacted by the Project.

Preamble:

Reference i) notes that operators of competitive facilities can be considered affected commercial third parties when the outcome of the application could reasonably be expected to have a significant adverse impact on their operations. Reference i) also notes that when concerns have been raised by commercial third parties and remain unresolved at the time of the filing, more detailed information should be provided by the project applicant.

Reference ii) notes that applicants should file information with the Board that would demonstrate that the project is not being cross-subsidized in an inappropriate manner and information on the level of market power held by the applicant and the level of effect of the project on commercial third parties.

In reference iii), Westcoast Energy Inc. (Westcoast) provides an estimate of the financial impact of NGTL's proposed facilities on Westcoast's gathering and processing and sales gas facilities. Westcoast estimates that the value of the Westcoast assets at risk of being by-passed and stranded is approximately \$360 million. In reference iii), Westcoast also estimates that the degree of potential underutilization of the South Peace Pipeline is 100 percent, of the McMahon Gas Plant is approximately 40 percent, and of the Zone 3 system is approximately 12 percent. In addition, Westcoast estimates in reference iii) that the loss of 12 percent of the firm contracts in Zone 3 would increase the Zone 3 toll by approximately 14 percent. Further, Westcoast estimates in reference iii) that every additional 100 MMcf/d of gas that is lost by Westcoast would result in a loss of approximately \$30 million in annual revenue from Zones 1, 2 and 3.

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Request:

- a) Given the guidance provided in the filing manual in references i) and ii), comment on Westcoast's estimated commercial impacts in reference iii). Include the following in your discussion:
 - a.1) whether NGTL's proposed rolled in tolling methodology inappropriately increases the potential commercial impacts on Westcoast; and
 - a.2) what role a revised tolling methodology could play in alleviating the potential commercial impacts on Westcoast.

Response:

NGTL believes the proposed tolling methodology for the Project accords with well established, long-standing tolling principles and will yield tolls for services that will utilize the Project facilities that are just and reasonable. NGTL has filed evidence demonstrating that neither the rolled-in tolling methodology nor the receipt point specific tolling methodology for either the Project as a whole or the Tower Lake Section involve any inappropriate cross-subsidization. The Board should not revise a tolling methodology that results in just and reasonable tolls solely to alleviate perceived or even potential commercial impacts on a third-party competitor. Promoting competition is an appropriate regulatory policy goal, however, competition is not a tolling principle, and the Board should not abandon long-standing and well-established tolling principles simply to enhance competition or otherwise protect a party from perceived or even actual competitive forces. If the Board determines tolls are just and reasonable, then it is up to the competitor pipelines to respond to any competitive challenges.

In any event, the Project alone does not create or increase, inappropriately or otherwise, any potential adverse commercial impacts on the Westcoast system; neither does the Project's proposed tolling methodology. The impacts Westcoast claims in reference iii) do not represent a reasonable assessment of the potential or probable commercial impacts of the Project on Westcoast's facilities or tolling of its services.

Westcoast's estimates are based on the assumptions that "the construction and operation of the Tower Lake Section on the basis proposed by NGTL" (i.e., the proposed rolled-in tolling methodology) would result in underutilization on the South Peace Pipeline of 100%, and that a corresponding reduction would result in the quantity of gas to be processed at the McMahon Gas Plant and the volumes subsequently transported on Zone 3. The hypothetical

numbers Westcoast used in responding to the NEB's information request 1.2 (c.2) are a simple mathematical calculation that reflect an arbitrary volume reduction and are not representative of any probabilistic assessment of the likelihood of any expected volume reductions on the Westcoast system. The assumptions used by Westcoast are also inconsistent with historical experience.

The Westcoast system remains full despite NGTL's previous expansions into NEBC,⁵ that have been tolled on the same basis proposed for the Project. In addition, recent and proposed expansions on Westcoast's Zone 2 and Zone 3 have been proposed to connect over 1 Bcf/d of incremental supply to the NGTL System.⁶

As recognized by Westcoast in its response to NEB 1.3(b), its existing pipeline infrastructure in Zones 1, 2, and 3 could not provide the service requested by CBRP. The only alternative to the Project would be a hypothetical project similar to the Tower Lake Section that would be owned by Westcoast and that it claims to be tolled on a stand-alone basis.⁷

CBRP has made the decision to have its gas gathered and processed in the Tower Lake area and in the area surrounding the Dawson Creek North Receipt meter station. The Tower Lake Section is designed to transport the resulting sales quality gas. In contrast, gas currently transported on the Westcoast South Peace Pipeline is raw gas that will not meet the quality requirements for the NGTL Tower Lake Section. As a result, in order for the Tower Lake Section to offload the South Peace Pipeline, producers would need to invest in additional upstream processing infrastructure. In addition, NGTL does not currently have the ability to receive more gas under FT-R service without adding new facilities downstream of the Tower Lake Section. Additional volumes in excess of 300 MMcf/d on the Tower Lake Section would also require additional facilities on that section. If producers sought to enter into incremental FT-R contracts to transport additional volumes on the Project, a new facilities application would be required.

The difference in tolls that would result on the Tower Lake Section with stand-alone tolling versus rolled-in tolling would not affect a producer's decision already transporting on the South Peace Pipeline to abandon its service on the South Peace Pipeline in favor of the Tower Lake Section. As discussed above, in order for producers to abandon service on the South Peace Pipeline and connect supply to the Project, the producers would need to invest in additional upstream processing infrastructure and would also need to underpin a facilities expansion on NGTL. The magnitude of these investments would dwarf the impact of the difference between stand-alone and rolled-in tolling on the Tower Lake Section. In other words, the difference in tolling would not influence producers' decisions of which gas value chain to connect to with their gas.

In contrast, existing shippers on Westcoast's South Peace Pipeline could renew contracts on a short-term basis that do not require major new investments. As contracts between Westcoast and its Zone 1 and Zone 2 shippers are not public, it is also unknown if existing Zone 1 shippers even have the contractual ability to move to competing gathering and processing alternatives for their current production. It is NGTL's experience that shippers prefer shorter-term to longer-term obligations. Considering these facts, and that Westcoast sought and received the tools to compete in the gathering and processing of raw gas through the Framework for Light-Handed Regulation, it is unlikely that Westcoast would simply refuse to compete with other midstream companies to retain its existing load in the upstream raw gas gathering and processing environment.

For these reasons, the proposed tolling methodology for the Tower Lake Section is unlikely to have any impact, and certainly no material impact let alone an inappropriate impact, on Westcoast, as alleged or otherwise. Existing production in the area, which is independent of the CBRP production, will remain connected to the South Peace Pipeline and unless that production is shut-in, should continue to flow and serve the market needs it currently meets. There is no credible reason to expect that raw gas volumes currently transported on Westcoast's South Peace Pipeline (340 MMcf/d according to reference iii), which are then processed at the McMahon Plant and then transported to and on Westcoast's Zone 3, would entirely and immediately stop serving the current need and instead be transported on the Tower Lake Section.

With respect to any hypothetical, potential impacts downstream of the South Peace Pipeline resulting from a reduction in flows on the South Peace Pipeline, NGTL observes that the demand currently met by raw gas received on the South Peace Pipeline would not vanish even if flows were to decrease on the South Peace Pipeline. Westcoast unreasonably assumes any reduction in flows on the South Peace Pipeline would result in an equal reduction in both quantities processed at the McMahon gas plant and subsequently transported on Zone 3. However, it is highly improbable that the demand in the markets currently served through Zone 3 would be diminished by a quantity equivalent to the reduced flows on the South Peace Pipeline.

As NGTL explained in its response to NEB 4.6, the primary markets in BC and the Pacific Northwest served through Station 2 and Zone 4 are stable, long-term and largely captive to the Westcoast system. As long as there is demand in these markets, producers will respond to appropriate market signals and connect supply required to meet demand. The Westcoast system is connected to major supply basins in NEBC, including the Montney Formation and Horn River Basin, such that it has and will continue to have access to competitive, lower cost supply in the WCSB. If there is a reduction in production in one area, it will be made up with competitive development in other areas such that the market demand continues to be met at market prices. Any decline in throughput on the South Peace Pipeline, should it even occur for other reasons, would likely be replaced by increased flow on other raw gas gathering pipelines through the McMahon and other Zone 2 gas plants, or other midstream infrastructure, and then move through Westcoast Zone 3, supplying Station 2 and connected downstream markets.

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For these reasons, there is no reasonable basis to expect that the Project, including the proposed tolling methodology for both the Groundbirch Mainline Loop and Tower Lake Section, will have a significant adverse impact on Westcoast's existing operations. The proposed tolling methodology for the Tower Lake Section is unlikely to have a material impact on any shipper decisions on Westcoast's South Peace Pipeline or downstream of the South Peace Pipeline, and therefore will not result in the economic impacts alleged by Westcoast.

Preamble:

In reference i), NGTL states that the proposed route of the permanent ROW crosses 69 tracts of land owned in fee simple by individuals and 13 tracts of land owned in fee simple by corporations.

In reference ii), NGTL states that freehold land acquisition activities, which commenced in Q4, 2015, are ongoing and section 87 notices were scheduled to be served to all landowners in Q1 2016.

In reference iii), NGTL states that once the permanent and temporary land requirements were finalized for the Project, NGTL completed its land acquisition packages for each landowner. In reference iii), NGTL states that it arranged further meetings with most of the Project landowners during Q1 2016 to:

- serve section 87(1) notices on landowners;
- present the proposed land acquisition documents;
- discuss issues related to land access and land rights acquisition, including compensation;
- discuss the process for reaching agreement about land access and land rights;
- provide updated Project information; and
- address questions or concerns that remain outstanding or have arisen since the point of last contact.

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Reference iii) further states that NGTL has reached agreement in regards to land access and land rights for 52% of the non-CAEPLA freehold land tracts.

References iv) and v) set out the Board's filing requirements for an applicant's proposed lands acquisition process, and land acquisition agreements.

Request: Please provide:

- a) an update on the status of service of notices on all owners of lands to be acquired pursuant to subsection 87(1) of the NEB Act;
- b) the timing of service of remaining notices;
- c) an update on the land acquisition status, both permanent and temporary, including how many easement agreements have been obtained and how many are outstanding; and
- d) the total number of individual and corporate landowners

Response:

a) and b)

NGTL has served 73 out of 77 notices pursuant to subsection 87(1) of the NEB Act to titled owners of lands crossed by the Project. Of the remaining notices to be served, one relates to a parcel that has recently changed ownership; the remaining notices are all to be served on an individual who was recently out-of-country. NGTL has now located these landowners and expects to serve the remaining notices by June 15, 2016.

- c) As of filing NGTL has obtained 43 easement agreements and 43 temporary work space agreements. Seventy easement agreements and 73 temporary work space agreements are still outstanding.
- d) As of filing this response, there are 60 individual landowners and 15 corporate landowners in addition to the 2 provincial Crown landowners (Government of AB and BC) on the Project.

Preamble:

The Board recognizes that an applicant may make numerous commitments to various parties during the regulatory review process of an application. Traditionally, in past conditions on Board Certificates (and/or Orders), the Board has required companies:

- to track all the commitments in a table;
- submit that table to the Board,
- periodically submit updates to the Board; and
- to post the table and updates on the company's project website.

The Board's objectives for environmental and socio-economic assessment are set out in reference i), the National Energy Board Filing Manual, two of which are that:

- there is an opportunity for meaningful public and Aboriginal participation; and
- the Board's process and its decisions or recommendations are transparent and reflect the input received from those participating in the environmental assessment and regulatory review process.

Reference ii) states that the Board expects an applicant to have a company-wide consultation program. Reference ii) further outlines the Board's expectations for a consultation program, including that a consultation program will:

- provide clear, relevant and timely information to potentially affected persons or groups;
- be accessible to and inclusive of all potentially affected persons or groups;
- be responsive to the needs, input and concerns of potentially affected persons or groups; and
- continue throughout the regulatory process, as well as the construction and operation phases of a project.

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The Board would like to hear from NGTL on how commitments can best be tracked for this Project. This should consider:

- the volume and complexity of commitments NGTL has made in respect of the Project;
- the need for the Board's process, decisions and recommendations to be transparent, and to reflect input received from those participating in the regulatory review process; and
- the Board's expectations for NGTL's consultation program.

Request:

- a) Please describe, and provide an example of, how NGTL would propose to track commitments, including any conditions or requirements attached to permits or authorizations for the Project, made in respect of the Project and include the following considerations:
 - a.1) how NGTL would ensure that all commitments are accounted for:
 - a.2) what opportunities affected parties would have to comment on the commitments and on their status;
 - a.2.i) how NGTL would address any comments or concerns raised:
 - a.3) how NGTL would ensure that the commitments are communicated to personnel during construction and operation of the Project;
 - a.4) how the timelines that are associated with the fulfillment of each commitment would be communicated:
 - a.5) how often NGTL would update the status of the commitments; and
 - a.6) how affected parties would be notified of any status updates.
- b) Using the example developed in 1), please provide a list of commitments NGTL has made in respect of the Project to date.

Response:

a) Please see below for NGTL's plans surrounding the commitment tracking for the Project.

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- a.1) NGTL would track all NEB imposed conditions and other federal regulatory commitments resulting from this proceeding in a table. Non-regulatory, contractual, and other private commitments would be tracked privately by NGTL and the counterparty.
- a.2) NGTL could post the tracking table described in a.1) on NGTL's Project webpage. An interested party would be able to monitor the webpage to track how NGTL meets commitments. This method of engagement would be in addition to NGTL's other direct Project engagement (e.g., mail outs, telephone calls, and inperson meetings) with directly affected districts, municipalities, landowners, and Aboriginal communities identified during the permitting process for the Project. If contacted by a directly affected party in relation to a commitment, NGTL would address material and actionable comments or concerns with the party.
- a.3) Commitments relevant to construction and operations are tracked by NGTL supervisors and inspectors. These commitments are then communicated to the relevant personnel based on the nature of their duties.

For example, with regards to wildlife, during construction the on-boarding process for new employees includes a briefing on Project specific environmental commitments that are both actionable by construction workers and relevant to the segment being constructed. These commitments may include: :

- observe for specific species of concern that may be located in the area
- suspend work immediately in the vicinity of any newly identified wildlife species of concern
- report all sightings to the NGTL Environmental Inspector (EI)

The NGTL EI is then responsible for implementation of appropriate mitigation, notifications to appropriate government agencies (if applicable) and tracking whether each Project environmental commitment is met.

- a.4) Due dates and completions associated with fulfilling a commitment could be communicated through updates to the tracking table described in the response to a.1) and a.2), in addition to other engagement already carried out by NGTL.
- a.5) For construction, NGTL could update the tracking table described in the response to a.1) periodically (e.g., every two months) up to an end-point (e.g., the in-service date). Post-construction Project-specific regulatory commitments often include their own filing requirements (e.g., public filings, such as filing with the NEB of a post-construction monitoring report). Post-construction, for both public and private commitments, NGTL remains engaged for the duration of the commitment with parties who may be directly affected by the commitment being met.

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- a.6) If interested, directly affected parties would be notified of status updates either through monitoring the tracking table described in the response to a.1) or through an alternative method of communication preferred by the party. For example, NGTL has ongoing engagement, including meetings, with Aboriginal groups with traditional territories crossed by NGTL assets, and NGTL mails out Project updates, which could include information on the updating of a tracking table and how a copy may be accessed or obtained.

Preamble:

In reference i) NGTL states that all of the customers for the Project have executed contracts that have a combination of primary and secondary terms that achieve a combined minimum term of 8 years. NGTL notes in reference i) that the terms and structure of the receipt agreements that underpin the Project are consistent with the terms applied in all constrained receipt areas of the NGTL System. NGTL further states in reference i) that it believes the structure achieves a reasonable balance between NGTL and industry requirements and provides an appropriate level of customer accountability.

In reference ii) PNG states that most other pipelines require long-term (15 to 20 year) contracts that do not have the right to move elsewhere, and the facilities are designed only for the level of contracts.

Request: Please provide, in table form:

- a) standard contract lengths for Canadian and North American pipeline extensions and expansions versus large new builds such as greenfield mainlines; and
- the designed and contracted capacities for Canadian and North b) American pipeline extensions and expansions versus large new builds such as greenfield mainlines.

Response:

NGTL has determined, based on an initial assessment, that there is no regulatory a) standard or standard contract lengths for Canadian and North American natural gas pipeline operators in contracting for services that require additional facilities (e.g., expansion or extension facilities). Rather, pipelines generally seek contract terms that are appropriate and reflective of the specific circumstances in which the entities operate, including commercial, industry, regulatory and other factors.

May 24, 2016 Page 1 of 4 While some pipelines specify minimum contract terms in their tariffs, typically, the length of pipeline contracts for Canadian and U.S. pipelines vary and often are negotiated between the pipelines and prospective shippers. These contracts can be for expansions of existing pipelines, extensions of existing pipelines, or greenfield mainline construction.

In Canada, NGTL is aware of three natural gas pipelines that specify in their tariff a minimum term for service that requires new facilities. The TransCanada Mainline specifies a minimum 15-year contract term for any new request for Firm Service that requires new or additional pipeline facilities. Foothills Pipe Lines Ltd specifies a minimum 10-year contract term for any new requests for Firm service that requires new or additional pipeline facilities. Union Gas Limited specifies a 10-year minimum contract term in its tariff for firm transmission service requiring new facilities.

As NGTL has described elsewhere, the NGTL System is unique relative to other transmission pipelines in Canada and the US in both commercial structure and operations, impart as a result of its large gathering function. NGTL has separate and distinct receipt and delivery services. All gas received on the NGTL System at a receipt point is commercially, and to a significant extent physically, comingled with gas from all other receipt points. That total amount of gas received is then immediately available in the NIT market for holders of delivery service and other market participants. As a result, delivery shippers might commercially source gas through NIT that is physically received from any receipt point on the NGTL System. With the bifurcation of receipt and delivery service on the NGTL System, a natural gas hub on the system is created. When supply is pooled into a single marketplace such as NIT on the NGTL System, markets are readily able to obtain long-term supply at the hub and parties are willing to contract for delivery capacity on a longer-term basis to meet their long term capital investment requirements. In contrast, other North American natural gas transmission pipeline systems employ a model where contracting is composed of a single, pathed contract that identifies primary receipt and delivery points.

For receipt shippers, contracts are tied to a specific receipt point during the primary term, which given the gathering function of the NGTL System can be tied to individual gas wells and a specific gas gathering and processing plant. To accommodate the different interests on its system, NGTL has structured its contract requirements to balance NGTL's need for accountability and shippers' need for flexibility. Both receipt and delivery shippers have sought flexibility through shorter minimum contract terms from NGTL. This overall approach reflects the interest of shippers who collectively see this risk model as being lower for NGTL, which reduces the cost to provide service. Thus, both receipt and delivery shippers have thus sought shorter minimum contract terms from NGTL.

Historically, NGTL has required a minimum commitment from its receipt shipper contracts consisting of one year of primary term plus three years of secondary term. NGTL has for recent expansions, including the 2017 Expansion Project, obtained longer receipt contract terms, consisting of a five-year primary term with a three-year secondary term on 75% of the volume. This approach is more closely aligned with the contract term requirements for delivery service that requires new pipeline facilities.

NGTL observes that Westcoast does not have a written expansion policy or tariff provision specifying contract terms for its Transmission facilities in Zones 3 and 4.² For Westcoast's proposed Jackfish Lake and High Pine expansion projects, the contract terms were established through an open season process with shippers bidding on term, subject to a specified minimum contract term of 10 years. This minimum contract term is comparable to the 8-year term of the receipt agreements that underpin the Towerbirch Project.

In the U.S., there are no clearly comparable contracting policies or practices for pipelines relative to NGTL. First, in the U.S., gathering systems are non-jurisdictional to the FERC. The rates and services are a matter of contractual practices, not federal regulation. For interstate gas transmission systems subject to FERC oversight, most major expansions of existing systems and greenfield pipelines are now undertaken through negotiated rate agreements, which are not the product of prescribed ratemaking policies or tariff-based service requests. These negotiated arrangements often reflect risk-sharing, a variety of contract lengths ranging from 5 to 30 years, and negotiated and often levelized rates that include levels of return on equity that reflect the risk allocation and interests of the parties.

b) NGTL understands that each pipeline has its own design methodology and approach although all use contracts as a basis for new builds. Based on NGTL's knowledge of pipeline companies, some Canadian pipeline companies design to meet peak contract levels with a loss of critical unit. US natural gas transmission pipeline companies tend to be designed to contracts.

NGTL has different design criteria depending on the facility type. For customer specific facilities, meter stations are triggered on firm contracts and designed to accommodate 100% of firm contracts. Lateral facilities such as the proposed Tower Lake Section, are triggered on firm contracts and designed to the long-term, local area peak forecast. Mainline Facilities, such as the proposed Groundbirch Mainline Loop, are triggered on firm contracts and designed to meet the peak aggregate design flows for the pipeline. NGTL does not have a loss of critical unit or outage protection facility in its design.

An example on the Westcoast system is the Stewart Lake extension project. Westcoast recently built the Stewart Lake Pipeline extension, which was applied for and approved

with a contract level of 169 MMcf/d, Subsequently to the project's approval, Westcoast executed additional contracts for the project of 300 MMcf/d which suggests that the proposed facilities had a capacity of at least 469 MMcf/d when originally proposed and currently has a capacity of 500 MMcf/d. In other words, the original application had contractual underpinning for approximately 34% to 36% of the applied for capacity.

In the U.S., the FERC has had a fundamentally different policy than the NEB regarding the tolling for new capacity, and thus the design and contracting for capacity has often differed between the two jurisdictions. In the U.S., transmission pipelines generally design capacity to meet contracts because of the FERC's policy of placing pipelines atrisk for capacity that is not contracted, absent a reasonable basis for having the design capacity exceed the contracted capacity (e.g., physically cannot design exactly to contract levels) or shippers have agreed to utilization risk of capacity built that exceeds the amount contracted.
