The project is located in Saulteau First Nations (SFN) traditional territory and traverses areas used by SFN members. SFN is an adherent to Treaty 8 and SFN members have constitutionally-protected Treaty Rights over the proposed project area. SFN and Spectra Energy Transmission (Spectra) have not been able to resolve SFN's concerns about the potential impacts of this project, related Spectra projects, and related industrial activities.

If granted intervenor status, SFN would provide submissions to the Board concerning potential adverse impacts on Aboriginal interests and appropriate avoidance or mitigation measures to lessen adverse impacts on SFN.

As an intervenor SFN would also be able to assist the Board by correcting inaccuracies in the record regarding Spectra's Aboriginal consultation. For example, Spectra has mischaracterized the nature of SFN's concerns about this project on page 37 of the Consultation Log (Document reference A80172-18). SFN's letter dated April 5, 2016 withdrew SFN's request to have Spectra's three project applications reviewed together and to consider the projects "designated projects" (Document reference: A76257-1). SFN did not say it had "no outstanding concerns" regarding the Wyndwood Expansion Project.
