2017 Project under National Energy Board Exemption Order XG-XO-100-2008

Pursuant to condition 1(c) of Exemption Order XG-XO-100-2008, Westcoast hereby provides the National Energy Board with notice of hazardous wastes encountered during the decommissioning of Boundary Lake Booster Station BS 13 [A81616]. Details are provided in Table 1, below.

Table 1: Identified Hazards, Mitigation Strategy and Disposal

Identified Hazards	Mitigation Strategy	Disposal
Asbestos Asbestos was identified in window caulking in the compressor building and window caulking and gaskets in the fuel gas building.	The identified asbestos-containing materials will be removed in accordance with abatement procedures as required by WorkSafeBC prior to the demolition.	Disposal will be at an approved hazardous materials disposal facility.
Lead-containing paint Twenty-three out of twenty-four paint samples collected were identified to be lead-containing.	Lead paint will be removed where pipe is to be cut.	Lead-paint coated material will be disposed appropriately at an approved facility.
Oil and glycol	All remaining oil and glycol is to be drained and captured.	Disposal will be at an approved hazardous materials disposal facility.
